Our team stayed in individual cottages just a few yards from the Caribbean Sea. Charlie DeTillis served as our guide and host. Charlie informed us of the history and current status of the New Missions Ministry and toured us around the area.



I had served at Children's Hope in 2012 and was excited to show Scott what God is doing through Alabama Baptists in this area. We stayed at the Alabama House, a State Board of Mission established Guest House on the Children's Hope Orphanage Compound. Our mission was to teach English as a Second Language (ESL) in the mornings to the children in the orphanage. During the afternoon we taught ESL at two different Haitian churches. The church members had advertised the classes in the community for a few weeks. We shared the Good News of Jesus Christ with about forty to fifty young adult students who had come to improve their English. ESL is a very effective avenue for evangelism. Scott shared his testimony during one of the classes and a young adult man accepted Jesus Christ as his Savior. The local Haitian pastor was present to follow up and provide continued discipleship.
